

## Ideas and hints for producing the podcast

The authors are encouraged to provide a short video or audio podcast presenting the key ideas of their paper as an incentive for the audience (max. 5 minutes, mp4 format).

### 1.) Recording with a web meeting system

The web meeting systems usually have a recording function that can be used. Images (foils, images, videos, etc.) can be integrated via "screen share". The spoken text is recorded. The speaker's video image can also be shown if you wish. You can do this as the sole participant of the meeting. However, it is also possible to involve co-authors in this way, even if they are not in the same place.

### 2.) Recording with a camera or a mobile phone

- a. You could take printed pictures or slides and speak to them.
- b. You could record a normal presentation (via projector or monitor) and speak to it.
- c. You could include a video of your laboratory or a trial and integrate it.
- d. You could record yourself while speaking something for the participants.

### 3.) A pure audio sequence would be another option.

We have intentionally not made any specifications so that everyone can draw attention to their contribution with an interesting podcast based on their own ideas.

The podcast in mp4 format can then be accessed and viewed from any smartphone at any location.

Please keep the video short (3 minutes, maximum 5 minutes), since we assume that long videos are often not viewed or not viewed until the end.
